Good afternoon,

I was very disturbed (and not a little annoyed) to learn recently that the planned Llanddewi Velfrey bypass may be scrapped.

I feel that this would be an outrage and do a serious injustice both to the people who live in the village and to Pembrokeshire as a whole. Our village acts as a bottleneck for the heavy traffic heading for the port at Fishguard and it is only through good fortune that there have been no fatalities here as I often see schoolchildren trying to dodge traffic to cross the road and have frequently had to brake hard to avoid vehicles overtaking dangerously on the stretch of road between Ffynon and the village. The junctions from Glan Preseli to the A40; from Llandaff Row to the A40 and at Cross Inn are hazardous due to the volume of traffic, I have sometimes waited as much as 10 minutes to exit in the morning and seen some hair-raising manoeuvres to try and get on the road. I do not feel lowering the speed limit would improve this in any way as it is the volume, not speed, of the traffic causing the issue.

I cannot understand why, after all this time and the many delays which have already taken place, that there is suddenly a necessity for a public consultation on a scheme which, if Costain had not folded, would already have commenced.

I look forward to hearing some sort of rational reasoning for this please.
